This workshop will explain new 504 Plan eligibility criteria under Federal Civil Rights Law and explore the protections provided for students with disabilities. Key differences between an IEP and 504 Plans will be discussed as well as standard and nonstandard accommodations that can be used in the classroom and for assessment.
